## Aim:


- To give pupils an awareness of BBC Children in Need, the work they do and possible fundraising activities.

## You will need:

- an interactive whiteboard;
- mime cards printed and given to pupil volunteers (before the assembly).

### Slide 1:

As pupils come into assembly, display the Crack the Code slide. Pupils can work out the title of the assembly as they are sitting down.

### Slide 2-3:

### Slide 5:

Display and read through the information slide on BBC Children in Need. Each bullet point will appear on a click. This could also be an opportunity to show some clips of the work BBC Children in Need does.



**What Is BBC Children in Need?**

- BBC Children in Need is a charity, making a difference to children and teenagers all over the UK. They support 2700 different projects in the UK, providing grants and supporting vulnerable young people.
- Since BBC Children in Need began, over £950 million has been raised for good causes and many disadvantaged young people have been helped by the money donated.
- In November, BBC Children in Need have an annual appeal night with lots of events taking place in order to raise money for charity.

 Pudsey Bear became the BBC Children in Need emblem in 1985 and in 1988, BBC Children in Need became a registered charity.
