Your discussion is as important as the scores you get on the quiz.

Instructions: use the quiz below to reflect on your project. Once you have completed the quiz, add up the scores, with strongly disagree counting as 0, disagree counting as 1, etc.

If the average score on this survey is between 0 and 10, consider engaging young people as consultants or contributors. If the score is between 9 and 27, consider engaging young people as partners or drivers. Consider having multiple people take this quiz, including young people and adults, to make sure the answers are not too biased by one person's opinion.
